Tom Andriola joined the University of California, at Irvine (UCI) in October 2019 as the Vice Chancellor for Information, Technology and Data responsible for ensuring the effective and strategic use of data and technology across all aspects of the UCI enterprise. He works closely with the campus, faculty and healthcare leaders to explore opportunities for technology and data to drive innovation and enhance the missions of teaching, research, patient care and public service.

Prior to joining UCI, he served as Vice President & Chief Information Officer (CIO) for the entire University of California System working with campus and medical center leaders to expand the use of technology strategically and realize operational synergies. Among his accomplishments, he created an organizational and technology platform to support the collaboration of 8,000 IT professionals across the University, launched a nationally-recognized IT Leadership Academy, and played a leading role in developing UC Health's big data strategy, which led to the creation of the UC-wide clinical data warehouse representing 16 million patients.

Prior to his university service, Andriola was a business leader in the healthcare informatics industry with Philips Healthcare, He was responsible for building businesses to serve hospitals and healthcare providers, bringing experience in developing solutions across the globe.

Andriola spent the earlier years of his career as a leader for multi-billion-dollar enterprises in the capacity of a global CIO and business transformation officer with organizations such as Marconi PLC, Sapien and Price Waterhouse Coopers.

Andriola serves on several boards, including Chairperson for CENIC and as a Director at OCHIN. He is also an advisor to several software startups and maintains advisory relationships across the university collaborating on research and innovation at the UCSD/UCI California Institute for Telecommunications and Information Technology, UCSF Center for Digital Health Innovation, and UC Davis Innovation Institute for Food and Health.

Andriola holds a bachelor's degree from George Washington University and a master's degree from the University of South Florida, and he has completed the Stanford Executive MBA program.
